 - -Presents your information as clearly and concisely as possibly
 - -Allows reader to see what you have accomplished in a rapid manner
- Consistency
 - -Allows for clearer communication and easy readability
 - -Verb usage
 - -Be strategic with bullet points, dates, headers, font and spacing
 - -Chronological order
